Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on Wednesday 17th May 2021 at 7.00pm in the Anderton Memorial Institute

1. Welcome

Cllr Metcalfe welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2. Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Cllr Midgley and Cllr Oakes

3. To approve the minutes of the meeting held on 1st May 2019 as a true and correct record.

It was RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting held on 1st May 2019 be approved and signed as a correct record of the meeting.

4. Chairman's Review

Cllr Metcalfe gave a review of activities in the parish over the previous 2 years these included –

- No cold calling scheme implemented in Linton Village and Linton Falls
- Village picnic party event on the green held on 7th July 2019, with Jacobs joint, childrens games and a brass band
- Parish Council Meetings held via Zoom due to Covid 19
- Covid village assistance supported by the Council
- Village benches refurbished
- 30 mph speed limit implemented through the village
- Double yellow lines implemented to increase safety and ease traffic flow through the village
- Two very large planning applications
 - Linton Camp - the Parish Council unsuccessfully objected against the planning application
 - Catchall Barn - the Parish council objected successfully against the planning application
- Increase of visitors to Linton Falls – the Parish Council working with the support group to make this safer
 - Successful Ward Member grant application from CDC received to purchase 30 road cones to assist in traffic management purchased January 2021
 - Successful Locality Budget grant application from NYCC received to purchase a defibrillator. This was installed in March 2021
- Village update letter distributed April 2021

Cllr. Metcalfe mentioned that the following activities were currently being worked on –

- Registration of the Village Green
- Registration of the Lanes
- Regeneration of the plantation

Cllr. Metcalfe thanked all the Councillors and the Clerk for the work they had all undertaken.

5. Letting of Lanes

It was proposed by Cllr Boothman and seconded by Cllr Stewart that the 'lanes remain unlet'.

6. Linton Community Fund

A short report on the activities of the Linton Community Fund was given. During 2019/21 the following grants were awarded:

- Ten grants for village projects
- Two young persons' education grant
- Two young persons' travel grants

Total payments had been made of £12,281

The annual payment from Tarmac made in September 2019 was £8,810 and in September 2020 was £8,965
